With access to major markets and roadways, proximity to a major freight airport and a major freight port, and existence of utility served sites, Henry County is the ideal location for logistics and distribution operations.

Locational Advantages

Twenty miles of Interstate 75 traverse the county with seven interchanges, and Interstate 675, which provides easy access to Interstate 85 and Interstate 20 via I-285, begins in the northern part of Henry County.

From this strategic vantage point, Henry County is less than two days' driving time to 80 percent of the U.S. population. Henry County is also 20 miles south of Atlanta, just minutes from Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport - the world's busiest - and within three hours to one of the country's fastest-growing seaports in Savannah.
